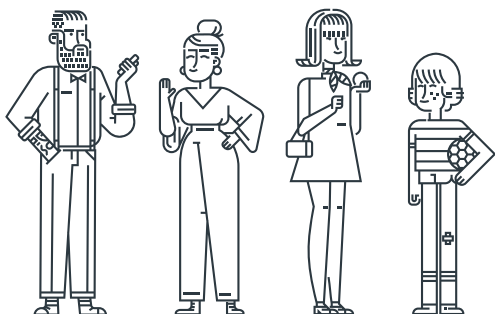

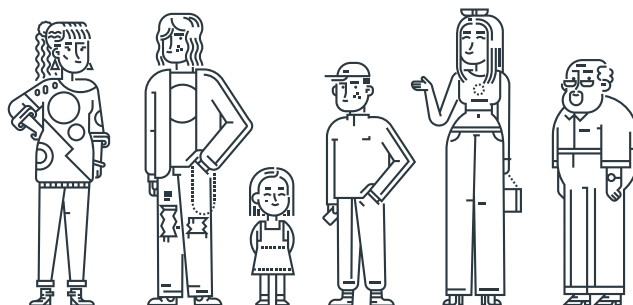

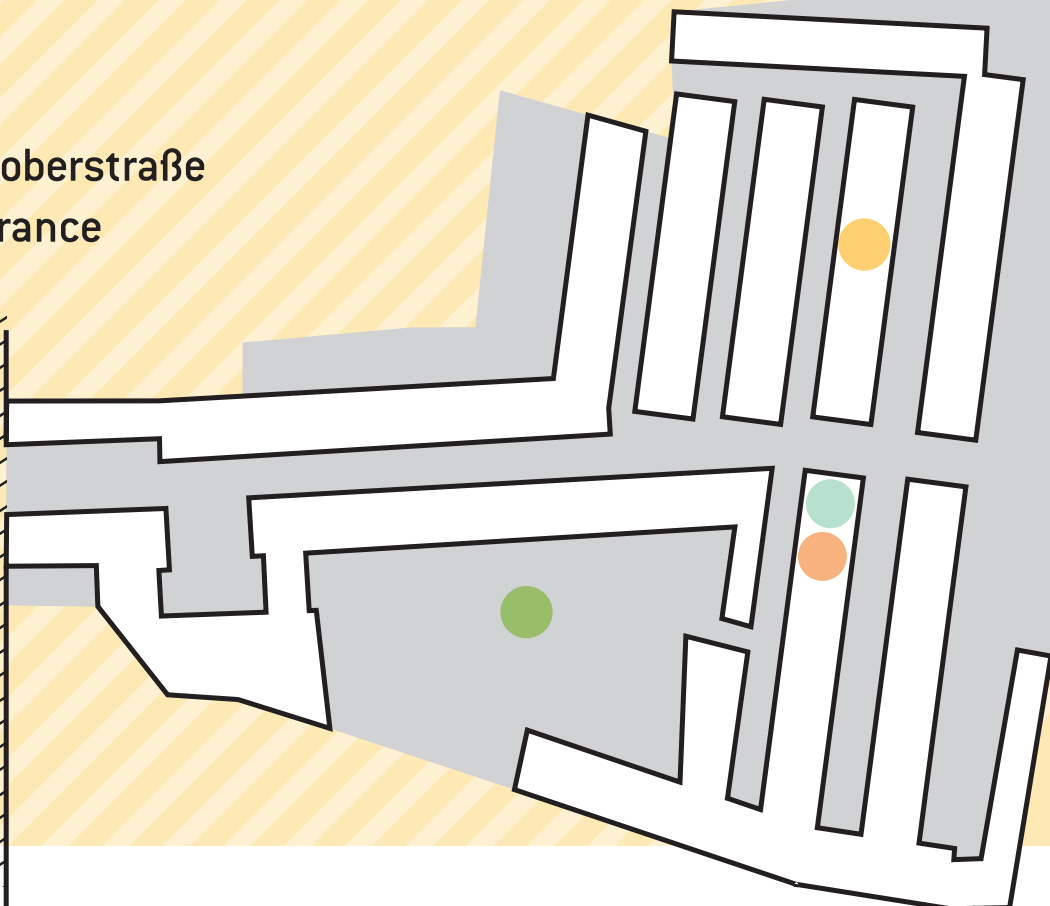


Museum in the Air-Raid Shelter

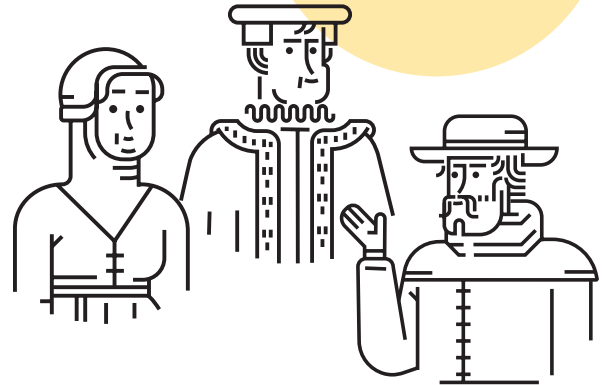

Museum of History ...

For half a millennium, the Fuggerei serves the purpose it was originally founded for. The ideas and decisions behind its history as well as the most important events and individuals are the topic of this exhibition. It ranges from the origins to the future of the Fuggerei.



... and Living

Parts of the flat, that is exhibited here, originate from 1517; its probable furnishing was reconstructed on the basis of historical examples. Exciting visualisations and audio stories paint a picture of how people lived in those rooms back in the day, the basis for which are residents' biographies from five centuries.

Coming to rest: How did families gain admittance to the Fuggerei? What were their personal stories? What moved them?

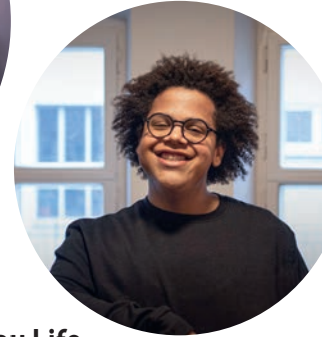

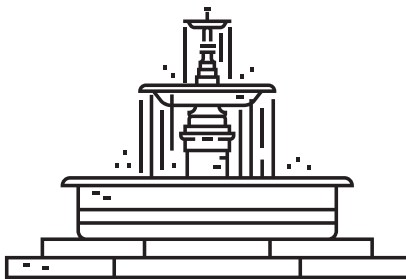
Museum of the Residents

Museum of Everyday Life

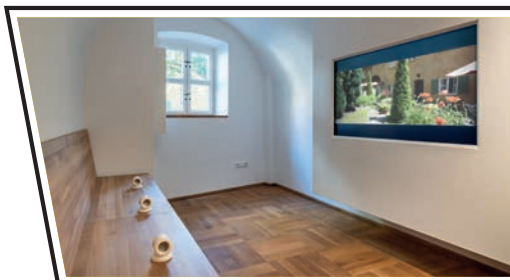

CONFIDENTIALITY ROOM

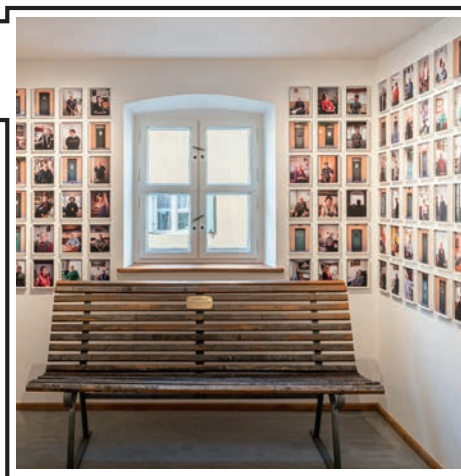

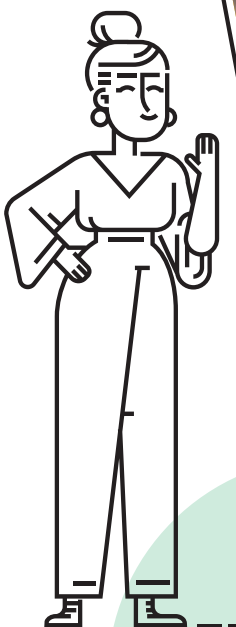


HEART CHAMBER

150 individuals in one room: Personalities, neighbours, friends and visitors from all over the world: the entire diversity of life at the Fuggerei.



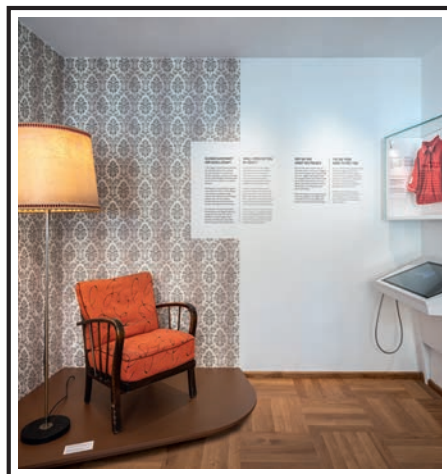


BATHROOM

Comfort up to date: The original bathroom of a resident – installed in the 1980s and furnished by the resident herself.



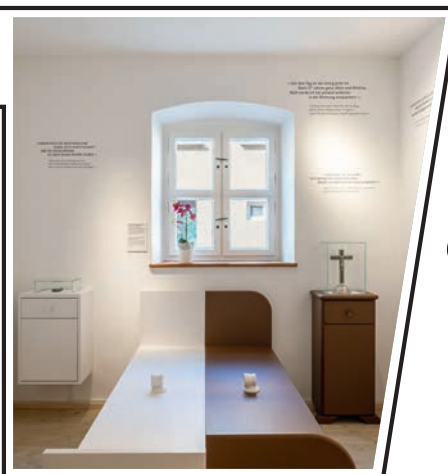

Everyday life between stove and table: Eating, heating and housekeeping reflect the changing living standards, not only at the Fuggerei.

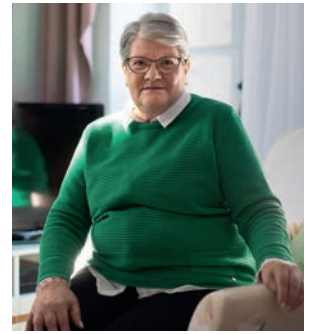


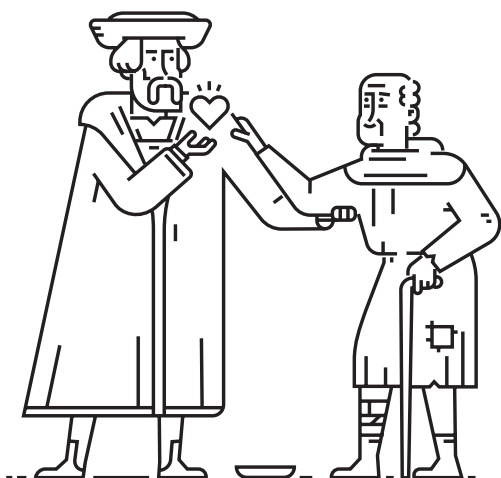
LIVING ROOM
